Levity III makes Australian debut in Forrest Place

Forrest Place has been transformed into an architectural marvel this week with *Levity III*, an inflatable 'luminarium' designed by Alan Parkinson from Architects of Air (UK). Part of the 2010 AWESOME Festival, this walk-through, inflatable light and sound sculpture is a chill-out zone of the most unusual kind.

Through numerous pods and winding paths, labyrinthine tunnels and soaring domes, visitors are invited to explore the luminarium in a medium of saturated and subtle hues. Vivid reflections of liquid colour spill across the curved walls creating a world apart from the normal and everyday. Described as a space somewhere between a womb and a cathedral, *Levity III* is a highly immersive experience that awakens a sense of wonder at the beauty of light and colour.

Entry to *Levity III* is free, but you must book a ticket at the AWESOME caravan in Forrest Place on the day. Come early to avoid missing out.

- * To enter *Levity III* you must remove your shoes
- * *Levity III* is accessible to wheelchair users
- * Children under 16 must be accompanied by an adult

The 2010 AWESOME Festival runs from 19 – 28 November in the Perth CBD, showcasing contemporary theatre, film & animation, visual arts, dance, music and new media. Many events are free and are suitable for the young and the young at heart.
