The Perth Cultural Centre will soon start to look very different when a team of International sand artists use 40 tonnes of sand to create an exciting large-scale sculptural display, *Sand Art Park*, as part of the 2008 AWESOME Festival.

Internationally acclaimed Netherlands sand artist, Hanneke Supply, will lead a team of World-Champion sand artists in creating a sand design entitled "The Domino Effect." Hanneke's work will feature domino-style stones with miniature people living inside them, exploring the idea that one small change can make a huge difference in society.

Hanneke invites young people into the Perth Cultural Centre to contribute to the artwork in Sand Art Workshops.
